2024 Overview

The past year proved to be a busy time for the museum and our patrons. We focused our efforts this year on improving the museum and our programs. The board visited three similar museums around Michigan to observe and get advice on potential improvements in our museum's displays and archives.

A highlight of the year was the completion and unveiling of the scale model of the USS Sequoia in June. You may recall that the Sequoia, the presidential yacht from 1933 to 1977, visited Pentwater in 1984 to great fanfare. (See our newsletter article, Fall of 2020.) An unfinished model of the Sequoia was donated to the museum and stayed in storage for several years. A model builder was found and contracted to complete the model of the Sequoia. The finished model was put on exhibit in the museum after the unveiling event and celebration.

We hosted our annual spring and summer dinners at the AgBio Research Center on Oceana Drive. Both programs presented at the dinners were enthusiastically received. At the spring dinner, board member Dan Girvan gave a travelog of boating around the Great Loop waterways of the eastern US. At the summer dinner, Valerie Van Heest described her team's efforts to locate and explore Lake Michigan shipwrecks.

The June garage sale was manned by many volunteers and raised a record amount of funds for the museum.

Behind the scenes, work continued on documenting the museum's collection of artifacts and scanning and digitizing paper artifacts using our new scanning and digitizing equipment. More

volunteers have come forward to assist in the effort of archiving our document artifacts. This work will continue for the foreseeable future.

Work on expanding the museum is still advancing, and fundraising has reached over \$750,000.

2025 promises to be an eventful year for the museum. We look forward to making new history with our members and friends, and we encourage more involvement by all who are interested in Pentwater's history. Thank you to our members, sponsors, volunteers, and donors for their support of the museum and the society.
